AN ACT RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT; AMENDING 74 O.S.  
1981, SECTION 85.12, AS LAST AMENDED BY SECTION 20,  
CHAPTER 337, O.S.L. 1990, AND SECTION 20, CHAPTER  
207, O.S.L. 1986, AS RENUMBERED BY SECTION 122,  
CHAPTER 222, O.S.L. 1987 AND AS LAST AMENDED BY  
SECTION 57, CHAPTER 236, O.S.L. 1987 (74 O.S. SUPP.  
1990, SECTIONS 85.12 AND 5003.7), WHICH RELATE TO  
THE OKLAHOMA CENTRAL PURCHASING ACT AND THE  
OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE; \* \* \* PROVIDING  
FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND  
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 11, line 2 1/2, add new Sections 11 through  
16 to read

"SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5025.1 of Title 74, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Sections 11 through 16 of this act shall be known and may be  
cited as the "Oklahoma Film Advisory Board Act".

SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5025.2 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Legislature finds that film and television production expenditures within the United States exceed Ten Billion Dollars (\$10,000,000,000.00) annually and that film and television production within a state generates substantial revenue for a state. It is the intent of the Legislature that the State of Oklahoma obtain a larger share of television and film production revenues through the operation of a film office with the assistance of a film advisory board.

SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5025.3 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Oklahoma Film Advisory Board Act:

1. "Advisory Board" means the Oklahoma Film Advisory Board;
2. "Motion picture production company" means a company engaged in the business of producing motion pictures intended for theatrical release or for television viewing; and
3. "Office" means the Oklahoma Film Office within the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.

SECTION 14. AMENDATORY Section 32, Chapter 207, O.S.L. 1986, as amended by Section 36, Chapter 266, O.S.L. 1990 (74 O.S. Supp. 1990, Section 5026), is amended to read as follows:

Section 5026. A. There is hereby created within the Oklahoma Department of Commerce, the Oklahoma Film Office. The Office shall have the primary responsibility in state government for promoting the State of Oklahoma as a location for motion pictures, television programs and videos. The Office shall assist the motion picture, television and video film industries by providing production contacts in the state, suggesting possible filming locations, and

conducting such other activities ~~that~~ as may be required to promote the state as a filming center.

B. The Oklahoma Film Office shall cooperate with other state and local offices as required to promote the film industry in the state.

C. The Oklahoma Film Office shall provide staff assistance to the Oklahoma Film Advisory Board.

D. The Oklahoma Film Office shall submit an annual report to the Oklahoma Film Advisory Board, the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate prior to January 1 of each year regarding the activities of the office. The report shall provide information about the number of filming productions that the Office has helped bring to the state and the economic impact of those productions.

SECTION 15. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5026.1 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. In the interest of involving private sector individuals who have knowledge of or interest in the development of the motion picture, television programming and video industry, an Oklahoma Film Advisory Board is hereby established. The Advisory Board shall consist of seven (7) members appointed as follows: one member shall be the Lieutenant Governor, two members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and two members shall be appointed by the Governor. The appointed members shall have experience related to the motion picture, television programming and video industry. Appointed members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing authority.

B. The Lieutenant Governor shall serve as chairman of the Advisory Board. The Advisory Board shall elect annually a vice-chairman and secretary. The Advisory Board shall hold meetings

monthly and at other times as deemed necessary by the chairman. A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.

C. The Oklahoma Film Advisory Board shall:

1. Assist in developing and approve goals and objectives for the Oklahoma Film Office;

2. Work with the Director of the Oklahoma Film Office in areas such as location development, talent search, production availability and development, and film industry promotion at trade shows;

3. Assist in developing and approve a marketing plan and a production manual for the Oklahoma Film Office;

4. Assist in developing a budget based on the future needs of the Oklahoma Film Office; provided, the Oklahoma Film Office shall provide the Advisory Board with an annual accounting of all expenditures, reimbursements and fund allocations;

5. Make recommendations to the Director of the Department of Commerce on budgetary considerations and major expenditures of the Oklahoma Film Office and on implementation of film industry programs; and

6. Assist the Oklahoma Film Office in preparation of the annual report.

D. Members of the Oklahoma Film Advisory Board shall not receive compensation for duties performed as members of the Advisory Board, but shall be reimbursed for travel and other necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties in accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

SECTION 16. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5026.2 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any motion picture production company which plans to film any scenes within the borders of the State of Oklahoma may register with the Oklahoma Film Office prior to the commencement of filming."
