AN ACT RELATING TO COUNTIES AND COUNTY OFFICERS;
AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO
DONATE CERTAIN SURPLUS PROPERTY TO A POLITICAL
SUBDIVISION WITHIN THE COUNTY; PROVIDING FOR
CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill
and insert

"AN ACT RELATING TO COUNTIES AND COUNTY OFFICERS;
AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO TRANSFER
CERTAIN SURPLUS PROPERTY TO A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION WITHIN
THE COUNTY; PROVIDING FOR RETURN OF CERTAIN SURPLUS
PROPERTY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN
EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 421.2 of Title 19, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A majority of the board of county commissioners may transfer any
machinery, equipment or vehicle belonging to the county, which is
deemed by the board to be surplus, to a political subdivision of the
state within that county which is in need of such machinery,

equipment or vehicle to benefit a significant part of the public served by the county; provided, however, one of the county commissioners voting in the majority is the county commissioner from whose district the subject property is to be transferred. The board of county commissioners may not deem any property to be surplus during the period of time beginning thirty (30) days before the filing period for any election of a county commissioner and ending the day after a county commissioner is sworn in as such. When the political subdivision receiving such property declares same to be surplus, the political subdivision shall transfer such property back to the county.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
