AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, line 12 1/2, add a new Section 1 to read

"SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 1981, Section 90.1, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 241, O.S.L. 1986 (74 O.S. Supp. 1990, Section 90.1), is amended to read as follows:

Section 90.1 A. Except as otherwise provided for in this section, any agency, board, commission, department or institution of the state which has an expenditure for postage of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or more for any one (1) fiscal year shall install a postage meter machine and have all purchases of postage recorded on that postage meter machine. Except, a field office or branch office of a state agency distantly located from the parent agency, and which office has an annual expenditure for postage of less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), may purchase postage stamps in the manner prescribed by Section 90.2 of this title and such purchases shall not be subject to the provisions of ~~paragraph 2~~ ~~of~~ subsection B of this section.

B. Any agency of the state which finds it necessary, in order to more efficiently and effectively carry out certain programs or functions, is hereby authorized:

~~1. to utilize the business reply mail account, bulk mailing account, postage due account or such other services offered by the United States Postal Service; and~~

~~2.~~ upon making application to the Director of the Office of State Finance showing sufficient need and upon approval by said Director, to purchase not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) worth of postage stamps during any one (1) fiscal year in the manner prescribed by Section 90.2 of this title, with a method of accountability for the use thereof to be maintained and subject to audit. Provided, however, the finance officer of such state agency shall keep and maintain a record of all postage stamp allocations within the agency.

C. Every state agency shall utilize business reply mail accounts, bulk mailing accounts, postage due accounts, Zip + 4 codes, mailer applied bar codes or such other services offered by the United States Postal Service for the purpose of reducing postal costs and promoting efficiency. The Office of Public Affairs shall promulgate rules necessary to implement the provisions of this subsection. Such rules shall establish guidelines providing when agencies are required to use such services."

AMENDMENT NO. 2. Page 1, lines 6 1/2 through 8 1/2, restore the title to read

AN ACT RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT; AMENDING 74 O.S.

1981, SECTIONS 90.1, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 1, CHAPTER 241, O.S.L. 1986 AND 324.8, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 1, CHAPTER 199, O.S.L. 1990 (74 O.S. SUPP. 1990, SECTIONS 90.1 AND 324.8), WHICH RELATE TO POSTAGE AND BUILDING CODES; MODIFYING CERTAIN

AUTHORITY OF STATE AGENCIES; REQUIRING EVERY STATE AGENCY TO UTILIZE CERTAIN SERVICES OFFERED BY THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE; REQUIRING PROMULGATION OF RULES RELATED THERETO AND REQUIRING SUCH RULES TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN GUIDELINES; MODIFYING CERTAIN PROHIBITION AGAINST ENACTING OR ENFORCING LOCAL ORDINANCES, RULES OR REGULATIONS WHICH VARY FROM STANDARDS OF CERTAIN BUILDING CODES; PROVIDING FOR ADOPTION OF CERTAIN IN LIEU CODES; CLARIFYING THAT ACT DOES NOT PREVENT OR TAKE AWAY FROM CERTAIN AUTHORITY TO AMEND CERTAIN ADOPTED CODES; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN EXCLUSION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY."
