AN ACT RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT; REQUIRING  
COUNCIL ON LAW ENFORCEMENT EDUCATION AND TRAINING  
CERTIFICATION FOR CERTAIN CAMPUS PEACE OFFICERS;  
ALLOWING CERTAIN INSTITUTIONS TO CREATE A CAMPUS  
POLICE DEPARTMENT OR CAMPUS PUBLIC SAFETY  
DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING WRITTEN CERTIFICATION TO  
OFFICERS; STATING REQUIREMENTS; AUTHORIZING  
INSTITUTIONS TO PRESCRIBE DUTIES OF OFFICERS,  
DESIGNATE UNIFORMS, FIX COMPENSATION AND PROVIDE  
WRITTEN COMMISSION OF APPOINTMENT AND AUTHORITY;  
STATING JURISDICTION; AUTHORIZING CERTAIN WORDS AND  
PHRASES TO BE DISPLAYED; PROVIDING CERTAIN OPTIONS  
FOR CERTAIN SCHOOLS; REPEALING 74 O.S. 1981,  
SECTIONS 360.11, 360.12, 360.13 AND 360.14, WHICH  
RELATE TO CAMPUS SECURITY; PROVIDING FOR  
CODIFICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND  
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill  
and insert

1981, SECTIONS 360.11, 360.12, 360.13, AND 360.14 -

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 360.15 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Campus Security Act of 1991".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 360.16 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in this act:

1. "Campus" means the real property, buildings and other improvements within this state owned, leased or rented by an institution of higher education or public school district for academic, research, student or employee residential or institutional support purposes, and shall include property used for the operation of auxiliary enterprises of the institution, but exclude other property from which income is derived;

2. "Campus police officer" means an individual holding a commission from and employed by an institution of higher education or public school district pursuant to this act, who may also be known as a "campus public safety officer";

3. "Commission" means a certificate of appointment by the governing board of an institution of higher education or board of education of a public school district of an individual certified as

a full-time police or peace officer, pursuant to Section 3311 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

4. "Governing board" means the board of regents or trustees that determines management policy and has responsibility for the general government of an institution of higher education or the board of education of a public school district; and

5. "Institution of higher education" means a college or university or other constituent agency of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education or a private college or university in this state whose accreditation is recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, pursuant to Section 4103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 360.17 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Governing boards of institutions of higher education and public school districts are authorized to establish campus police departments pursuant to Section 4 of this act, employ and commission campus police officers and, subject to the approval of the Department of Public Safety, designate uniforms, badges and insignia to be worn by such officers and displayed on vehicles or other equipment of the department. Persons employed by a governing board which has established a campus police department but who are not campus police officers shall not be permitted to wear said uniforms, badges or insignia. Campus police departments may also be known as campus public safety departments.

B. The commission of a campus police officer may be suspended by the governing board for any reason or may, for cause, be revoked by the governing board or suspended or revoked by the District Attorney in whose district the campus police officer is employed. The commission of a campus police officer convicted of a felony or of a crime involving moral turpitude shall, if not previously

revoked, be revoked upon conviction. The commission of a campus police officer no longer employed by the governing board, except an officer who is retiring, shall be relinquished to the board at the time of cessation of said employment. Whenever a commission is revoked or relinquished, the campus police department shall take possession of all insignia, badges, identification cards and weapons issued to the officer. A person who fails to relinquish said insignia, badges, identification cards and weapons shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment in the county jail for not to exceed one (1) year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

C. Governing boards shall notify the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) whenever an officer is commissioned or a commission is relinquished or revoked. The governing boards shall provide CLEET with all information regarding commissioned officers requested by CLEET.

D. A campus police officer employed pursuant to this act shall not be a member of the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System or the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System unless otherwise qualified by law.

E. Nothing in this act shall be construed as prohibiting governing boards, whether or not they establish campus police departments pursuant to this act, from making agreements with law enforcement agencies or private security agencies for provision of services or from employing security officers, watchmen, traffic control personnel or other persons for the performance of safety or security duties for which such personnel are qualified and trained.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 360.18 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Municipal police departments and county sheriffs' offices having overlapping or concurrent jurisdiction with a proposed campus police department shall enter into agreements with the proposed campus police department recognizing jurisdictional boundaries and providing for mutual support assistance. Said agreements shall be accomplished within sixty (60) days of the date that the governing board provides notice of intent to establish a campus police department to the municipal police departments or county sheriffs' offices. When said agreements have been completed and at least one campus police officer has been commissioned pursuant to this act, the campus police department shall be deemed established and shall have the same authority as a municipal police department except as such authority may be limited by the governing board.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 360.19 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Criminal fines, penalties, fees or penalty assessments imposed pursuant to state law or municipal ordinance as the result of any violation filed in a municipal or district court shall be collected and distributed as required by law.

SECTION 6. REPEALER 74 O.S. 1981, Sections 360.11, 360.12, 360.13, and 360.14, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 1991.

SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
