BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1853 of Title 74, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma Department of Tourism and Recreation shall
establish a cost center reporting system for all budget activities
of the Department. Internal performance audits shall be conducted
on each budget activity once every two (2) years. Performance audit
reports shall be submitted to the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation

Commission, who shall file such reports with the Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, State Auditor and Inspector, and chairpersons of the Appropriation Committees and the Tourism and Recreation Committees of both the House of Representatives and the Senate.

B. In addition to such other audits as may be required of or desired by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, the Department shall annually have a financial statement audit performed in accordance with Section 212A of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The costs associated with the performance of such audit shall be paid by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department.

C. The Commission shall provide notice to Department employees affected by this section of the prohibited acts and the penalties provided for in this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1992.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
