AN ACT RELATING TO SCHOOLS; AMENDING 70 O.S. 1991,
SECTION 7-105, WHICH RELATES TO SCHOOL DISTRICT
CONSOLIDATION; REQUIRING A VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL
AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT MEMBERSHIP ELECTION; PROVIDING
PROCEDURE FOR ELECTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE
DATE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause and entire bill
and insert

"AN ACT RELATING TO SCHOOLS; STATING LEGISLATIVE INTENT THAT
ENROLLMENT AT UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA COLLEGE OF MEDICINE BE
INCREASED, THAT INCREASED ENROLLMENT SLOTS BE RESERVED FOR
STUDENTS WHO COMMIT TO PRACTICE IN RURAL COUNTIES AND THAT
CERTAIN DOCTORS AGREE TO TREAT MEDICAID PATIENTS; PROVIDING
FOR NONCODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, the Board of Regents of
the University of Oklahoma, and the University of Oklahoma College
of Medicine cooperate to make it possible for ten percent (10%) more

students to enroll in the College of Medicine than were enrolled as first-year medical students during the 1991-92 year. The Legislature further states its intent that a number of slots equal to the ten percent (10%) increase should be reserved for students who commit to practice medicine for five (5) years following his or her graduation from medical school in a rural county in the State of Oklahoma having a population of less than fifty thousand (50,000) persons according to the last preceding Federal Decennial Census. It is the intent of this Legislature that these doctors will see medicaid patients during the term.

SECTION 2. The provisions of Section 1 of this act shall not be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
