AN ACT RELATING TO CONGRESSIONAL AND LEGISLATIVE
DISTRICTS; AMENDING 14 O.S. 1981, SECTIONS 80 AND
108, WHICH RELATE TO QUALIFICATIONS FOR CANDIDATES
FOR THE STATE LEGISLATURE; CLARIFYING RESIDENCY
REQUIREMENTS FOR CANDIDATES FOR THE STATE SENATE
AND STATE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES; AND PROVIDING
AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 14 O.S. 1981, Section 80, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 80. To file as a candidate for the Senate in any
senatorial district, one must have been a registered voter in the
district and a resident ~~residing~~ whose actual and principal place of
residence is at the time of filing and has been within said district
for at least six (6) months immediately preceding the filing period
prescribed by law. Any member of the Senate whose district has been
changed by a reapportionment may change residence with the intent of
becoming qualified to seek reelection in such district in the first
election applicable to such district following the reapportionment
without thereby being deemed to have vacated his existing office.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 14 O.S. 1981, Section 108, is amended to read as follows:

Section 108. To file as a candidate for the House of Representatives in any representative district, one must have been a registered voter in such district and a resident ~~residing~~ whose actual and principal place of residence is at the time of filing and has been within said district for at least six (6) months immediately preceding the filing period prescribed by law. Any member of the House of Representatives whose district has been changed by a reapportionment may change residence with the intent of becoming qualified to seek reelection in such district in the first election applicable to such district following the reapportionment without thereby being deemed to have vacated his existing office.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective September 1, 1991.
