

ENGROSSED HOUSE  
BILL NO. 1141

AN ACT RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT; ALLOWING CERTAIN  
MEMBERS TO WITHDRAW FROM THE OKLAHOMA PUBLIC  
EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM; PROVIDING PROCEDURE;  
PROVIDING FOR NONCODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN  
EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. Any person who was employed, prior to July 1, 1990, by an employer that is subject to the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System and was prohibited from becoming a member of the system because the person was receiving a retirement benefit from another state retirement system but was required to become a member of the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System upon repeal of the prohibition, may withdraw from the system. Any such person may withdraw from the system upon written notification received by the System before January 1, 1992.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this act shall not be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
