AN ACT RELATING TO OIL AND GAS; AUTHORIZING THE
GOVERNOR TO JOIN WITH THE GOVERNOR OF ANY OTHER
STATE IN DECLARING A LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS
EMERGENCY; PROVIDING FOR EXEMPTION FROM CERTAIN
LICENSES, PERMITS OR CERTIFICATES FOR CERTAIN
TIMES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN
EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 421.1 of Title 52, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Governor of Oklahoma is hereby authorized, for and on
behalf of the state, to join with the governor of any other state in
declaring a liquefied petroleum gas emergency. When the declaration
is issued, trucks and operators carrying liquefied petroleum gas and
meeting all certification, permit, and licensing requirements of the
federal government and their home state shall be permitted to
transport liquefied petroleum gas in and through Oklahoma without
obtaining any license, permit, or certification required by this
state.

B. This exception and waiver of Oklahoma licensing, permitting, and certification requirements regarding trucks and operators transporting liquefied petroleum gas shall be valid only during the period of the declared emergency.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
