AN ACT RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF THE PARDON AND
PAROLE BOARD; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THERETO;
STATING PURPOSES; PROVIDING FOR THE DUTIES,
COMPENSATION, AND NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES; LIMITING THE
SALARY OF THE DIRECTOR; LIMITING THE NUMBER OF
FULL-TIME-EQUIVALENT EMPLOYEES; LIMITING CERTAIN
EXPENDITURES; PROVIDING BUDGETARY LIMITATIONS;
PROVIDING LAPSE DATE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE;
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Office of the
Pardon and Parole Board from any monies not otherwise appropriated
from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal
year ending June 30, 1992, the following amount or so much thereof
as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Office of
the Pardon and Parole Board by law:

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Office of the Pardon and Parole Board shall be set by the Chief Administrative Officer. The salary of the Chief Administrative Officer shall not exceed Forty-three Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$43,400.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992. The Office of the Pardon and Parole Board for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. The appropriation made by this act shall be subject to fiscal year limitations and may be encumbered through June 30, 1992. Any unexpended funds remaining after November 15, 1992, shall lapse and be transferred to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 1991.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
