AN ACT RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES; MANDATING A PILOT PROGRAM FOR THE FUNDING OF MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATOR MANUALS; SPECIFYING DUTIES OF THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY; PROHIBITING THE ADVERTISING OF CERTAIN PRODUCTS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-105.1 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Department of Public Safety shall establish a pilot program to contract with advertisers for the placement of advertisements in the motor vehicle operator manuals distributed by the Department. The Commissioner of Public Safety shall be responsible for promulgating guidelines for the pilot program. The purpose of the program is to collect monies, other than state-appropriated monies, for the printing and distribution of the operator manuals. The Commissioner shall file a report on the pilot program with the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate upon completion of one (1) year

of the pilot program. No advertisements advertising any alcoholic beverages or tobacco products shall be accepted for placement in the operator manuals.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1991.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
