AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY;  
PROHIBITING THE DISPOSAL OF CERTAIN SOLID WASTE;  
PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS BY THE  
COMMISSIONER OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE DEPARTMENT OF  
HEALTH; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING  
AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2262.1 of Title 63, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

No person shall bring into Oklahoma any solid waste as defined  
by Section 2253 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes which  
originated or was collected outside the territorial limits of  
Oklahoma, until the Commissioner of the Oklahoma State Department of  
Health determines that such action can be permitted without  
endangering the public health, safety and welfare and the Oklahoma  
State Board of Health has promulgated rules permitting and  
regulating the treatment and disposal of such waste in this state.  
Backhauling of food products which are unprotected by sealed glass

or metal containers is prohibited in trucks that bring solid waste for disposal in Oklahoma.

The provisions of this section shall also apply to out-of-state septic tank waste.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
