( CHILDREN - CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS ON  
PERSONS WORKING WITH MINORS - AUTHORIZING  
ADDITIONAL FULL-TIME-EQUIVALENT EMPLOYEES -  
EMERGENCY )

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 404.2 of Title 10, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any employer in private industry, or hiring administrator of  
volunteer services, may request an Oklahoma State Bureau of  
Investigation criminal history record check of any current employee  
for a position of employment for which the primary purpose is the  
providing of services to or for persons under the age of eighteen  
(18). Such employers shall not require the current employee to pay  
the fee charged by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for  
obtaining a copy of the current employee's criminal history record  
for this business purpose. Prior to a background check being made  
on a current employee, the employer or administrator shall give  
notice to the current employee that a criminal history record check  
may be conducted on the current employee by the Oklahoma State  
Bureau of Investigation.

Prior to a background check being made on a current employee,  
the administrator of volunteer services shall give notice to the  
current employee on whether the administrator of volunteer services

or the current employee will be required to pay the fee charged by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for obtaining the copy of the current employee's criminal history record.

B. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation may employ additional full-time-equivalent employees, if necessary, to perform criminal history record checks as provided for in this section. Any additional full-time-equivalent employee hired pursuant to this subsection shall be funded from the OSBI Revolving Fund. The Director has the authority to implement the provisions of this section.

C. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation may establish a procedure for billing monthly those agencies, businesses, or individuals which request in excess of fifty (50) criminal history record checks in any fiscal year.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 150.29 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created a petty cash fund within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. Said petty cash fund shall be in such amounts as are determined to be necessary by the Director of State Finance and the Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. Provided, however, the amount of the petty cash fund shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). Petty cash funds may be expended for the providing of change for cash payments for criminal history record checks. Said funds may be reimbursed by the Director of State Finance upon the filing of a claim with the proper receipts showing the disbursements therefrom, reimbursement to be made from the OSBI Revolving Fund. The Director of State Finance shall prescribe all forms, systems and procedures for administering the petty cash fund.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1992.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
