AN ACT RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES; AMENDING 47 O.S.
1991, SECTION 11-401, WHICH RELATES TO RIGHT-OF-
WAY; REQUIRING DRIVERS IN A RESIDENTIAL AREA TO
YIELD AT MAIN-TRAVELED ROAD; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS;
AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 1991, Section 11-401, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 11-401. (a) The driver of a vehicle on a county road
approaching an intersection with a state or federal highway shall
stop and yield the right-of-way to a vehicle which has entered the
intersection or which is so close thereto as to constitute an
immediate hazard.

(b) The driver of a vehicle on a residential road or street
approaching an intersection with a main-traveled road or street
shall stop and yield the right-of-way to a vehicle which has entered
the intersection or which is so close thereto as to constitute an
immediate hazard. As used in this subsection, residential road or
street shall mean every road or street within one-half mile from an
intersection with a main-traveled road where the property contiguous
to the road or street is improved or zoned to be improved with

residences and is used primarily to go to and from such residences.
Main-traveled road or street shall mean every road or street
especially designed for through traffic, entrance into which may be
limited at intersections where all entering vehicles shall stop or
yield the right-of-way.

(c) When two vehicles enter or approach an intersection from different highways at approximately the same time, except in paragraphs (a) and (b) above, the driver of the vehicle on the left shall yield the right-of-way to the vehicle on the right.

~~(e)~~ (d) The right-of-way rules declared in paragraphs (a) ~~and~~, (b) and (c) are modified at through highways and otherwise as hereinafter stated in this chapter.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1992.
