AN ACT RELATING TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF POLLUTION
CONTROL; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS THERETO; STATING THE
PURPOSES; PROVIDING FOR DUTIES AND COMPENSATION OF
EMPLOYEES; LIMITING THE SALARY OF THE DIRECTOR;
PROVIDING BUDGETARY LIMITATIONS; PROVIDING A LAPSE
DATE; PROVIDING AN OPERATIVE DATE; AND DECLARING AN
EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the State Department
of Pollution Control from any monies not otherwise appropriated from
the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year
ending June 30, 1992, the following amount or so much thereof as may
be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Department
of Pollution Control by law:

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of
Pollution Control from any monies not otherwise appropriated from
the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year

ending June 30, 1992, the sum of Sixty-five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00) for the purpose of matching federal Leaking Underground Storage Tank funds.

SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Department of Pollution Control by law shall be set by the Pollution Control Coordinating Board. The salary of the Director shall not exceed Forty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$47,500.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992. The State Department of Pollution Control for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 4. The appropriations made by this act shall be subject to fiscal year limitations and may be encumbered through June 30, 1992. Any unexpended funds remaining after November 15, 1992, shall lapse and be transferred to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.

SECTION 5. This act shall become operative July 1, 1991.

SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
