AN ACT RELATING TO THE OKLAHOMA WATER RESOURCES
BOARD; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THERETO; STATING
PURPOSE; PROVIDING FOR DUTIES AND COMPENSATION OF
EMPLOYEES; LIMITING THE SALARY OF THE EXECUTIVE
DIRECTOR; PROVIDING BUDGETARY LIMITATIONS;
AUTHORIZING CERTAIN EXPENDITURES FROM THE STATEWIDE
WATER DEVELOPMENT REVOLVING FUND; MAKING CERTAIN
POSITIONS CONTINGENT UPON PROCUREMENT OF FEDERAL
FUNDS; PROVIDING FOR DEPOSITS TO THE STATEWIDE
WATER DEVELOPMENT REVOLVING FUND; PROVIDING FOR FEE
INCREASES AND SOLICITATION OF FEDERAL FUNDS FOR
CERTAIN PURPOSES; PROVIDING LAPSE DATE; PROVIDING
AN OPERATIVE DATE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma Water Resources Board from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992, the following amount or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Water Resources Board by law:

Personal Services

\$2,852,909.00

Other Operating Expenses

483,882.00

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Water Resources Board by law shall be set by the Oklahoma Water Resources Board. The salary of the Executive Director shall not exceed Fifty-six Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$56,400.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board is hereby authorized to expend in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992, the following amount or so much thereof as may be necessary from the Statewide Water Development Revolving Fund for the following purposes:

Sardis Reservoir:

Repayment of Water Supply

Storage Contracts \$ 894,535.00

Waste Water Facility Construction Program:

90 Match 1,572,400.00

91 Match 3,360,000.00

Corp of Engineers 30,000.00

TOTAL \$5,856,935.00

SECTION 4. Of the one hundred one (101.0) full-time-equivalent employee positions authorized in Section 2 of this act, two (2) full-time-equivalent employee positions shall be filled contingent upon the procurement of federal funds. Said two (2) full-time-equivalent employee positions supported by federal funds shall be terminated when federal support of those positions is discontinued.

SECTION 5. It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature that all monies recovered and paid to the State of Oklahoma pursuant to judgment or settlement as a result of disputes arising under interstate stream compacts shall be credited to the Statewide Water Development Revolving Fund.

SECTION 6. It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature that the Oklahoma Water Resources Board raise fees and/or solicit federal funds sufficient to fully support the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Program.

SECTION 7. The appropriation made by this act shall be subject to fiscal year limitations and may be encumbered through June 30, 1992. Any unexpended funds remaining after November 15, 1992, shall

lapse and be transferred to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.

SECTION 8. This act shall become operative July 1, 1991.

SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
