AN ACT RELATING TO CITIES AND TOWNS; AMENDING 11 O.S.
1991, SECTIONS 49-100.11, 49-111, 50-105.6, AND 50-
116.1, WHICH RELATE TO THE OKLAHOMA FIREFIGHTERS
PENSION AND RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND THE OKLAHOMA
POLICE PENSION AND RETIREMENT SYSTEM; PROVIDING AN
EXCEPTION TO THE REQUIREMENT THAT ALL BENEFITS
SHALL BE PAID BY CERTAIN RETIREMENT SYSTEMS;
CLARIFYING THE REQUIREMENT THAT CERTAIN EMPLOYERS
ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PAYMENT OF SALARY WHEN
CERTAIN EMPLOYEES ARE DISABLED FOR A PERIOD OF NOT
LESS THAN SIX MONTHS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 1991, Section 49-100.11,
is amended to read as follows:

Section 49-100.11 A. All employee and employer contributions
and dedicated revenues shall be deposited in the Oklahoma
Firefighters Pension and Retirement Fund in the State Treasury. The
State Board shall have the responsibility for the management of the
Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement Fund, and may transfer
monies used for investment purposes by the Oklahoma Firefighters
Pension and Retirement System from the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension

and Retirement Fund in the State Treasury to the custodian bank or trust company of the System.

B. All benefits, with the exception of Section 49-111 of this title, payable pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System, refunds of contribution and overpayments, and all administrative expenses in connection with the System shall be paid from the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement Fund upon warrants or vouchers signed by two persons designated by the State Board. The State Board may transfer monies from the custodian bank or trust company of the System to the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement Fund in the State Treasury for the purposes specified in this subsection.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 1991, Section 49-111, is amended to read as follows:

Section 49-111. Whenever any member of the fire department of any municipality, on account of sickness or temporary disability, caused or sustained while in the discharge of the member's duty as such member, and is unable to perform the member's duties, the member's salary shall be paid by the municipality to the member and shall continue while the member is sick or temporarily disabled for a period of not less than six (6) months, after which said period the provisions of Sections 49-103 et seq. of this title shall apply.

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 1991, Section 50-105.6, is amended to read as follows:

Section 50-105.6 A. All employee and employer contributions and dedicated revenues shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement Fund in the State Treasury. The State Board shall have the responsibility for the management of the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement Fund, and may transfer monies used for investment purposes by the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System from the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement Fund in the State Treasury to the custodian bank or trust company of the System.

B. All benefits, with the exception of Section 50-116.1 of this title, payable pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System, refunds of contribution and overpayments, and all administrative expenses in connection with the System shall be paid from the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement Fund upon warrants or vouchers signed by two persons designated by the State Board. The State Board may transfer monies from the custodian bank or trust company of the System to the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement Fund in the State Treasury for the purposes specified in this subsection.

SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 1991, Section 50-116.1, is amended to read as follows:

Section 50-116.1 Whenever any member of the police department of any municipality is unable to perform the member's duties because of sickness or temporary disability caused or sustained while in the discharge of the member's duty as such member, the member's salary shall be paid by the municipality to the member and shall continue while the member is sick or temporarily disabled for a period of not less than six (6) months, after which said period the provisions for permanent total or permanent partial disability benefits of the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System shall apply.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
