A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 13, 1991, AS "STUDENT INVENTION DAY" AT THE OKLAHOMA STATE CAPITOL; AND DIRECTING DISTRIBUTION.

WHEREAS, our nation has thrived on the innovative nature of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the need for innovation is important for our young people who face increasingly complex changes in our social, industrial and technological life; and

WHEREAS, Congress adopted the first United States Patent Act in 1790, to spur the advancement of the sciences in a young and growing country by rewarding the innovative who contribute to the well-being of all; and

WHEREAS, the process of invention teaches our young people thinking skills and problem solving skills; and

WHEREAS, the annual tribute to inventors coincides with the anniversary of the birth of one of our nation's foremost inventors, Thomas Alva Edison; and

WHEREAS, the opportunity for developing critical thinking skills is recognized as an important contribution toward developing the full creative potential of Oklahoma's youth; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature is proud to honor the top 165 student inventors from across the state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 43RD OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT Wednesday February 13, 1991, be designated "Student Invention Day" at the Capitol.
