A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION EXPRESSING OKLAHOMA'S DESIRE THAT
UNITED AIRLINES LOCATE ITS MAINTENANCE FACILITY IN
OKLAHOMA; AND DIRECTING DISTRIBUTION.

WHEREAS, Governor David Walters called the Oklahoma Legislature into Special Session in January of this year for the purpose of enacting an incentive package for United Airlines; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature, in the minimum of time required by law for enacting legislation, overwhelmingly enacted an incentive package for United Airlines; and

WHEREAS, on February 26, 1991, the voters of Oklahoma County went to the polls and approved, with a 72% yes vote, a temporary one-cent county sales tax as an incentive to locate airline maintenance facilities in Oklahoma County; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature, Oklahoma County, the City of Oklahoma City, the business community and labor unions all worked hand in hand in promoting and passing the incentive legislation and the Oklahoma County sales tax proposal; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma's educational system is ready and willing, through its nationally recognized vocational and technical education system, to assist United Airlines in the training of its employees; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma's very favorable weather and central location would be most advantageous for future operations of United Airlines; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma City metropolitan area has available the most affordable housing of any major metropolitan area in the country; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Oklahoma have clearly demonstrated their most sincere desire and intent that they want United Airlines to come to the Sooner State, where they feel the start of a long and prosperous relationship would indeed grow and grow.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 43RD OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature hereby expresses to United Airlines that the citizens of Oklahoma stand "United" for locating your proposed maintenance facilities in Oklahoma City.

THAT on behalf of the citizens of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Legislature says to United Airlines, "come fly the friendly skies of Oklahoma".

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Stephen Wolf, the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of United Airlines.
