A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DECLARING MARCH 12, 1992, "GIRL
SCOUTS 80TH ANNIVERSARY DAY".

WHEREAS, March 12, 1992, is the 80th anniversary of the establishment of the Girl Scouts of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 1950, the Girl Scouts became the first youth organization for girls and young women to be granted a federal charter; and

WHEREAS, the programs and activities of the Girl Scouts instill in the girls and young women of Oklahoma principles that are moral and ethical, and habits, practices, and attitudes that are conducive to good character, citizenship, health, and service to others; and

WHEREAS, by fostering in girls and young women the qualities upon which the strength of Oklahoma depends, the Girl Scouts has significantly contributed to the advancement of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, this state is justifiably proud of the Girl Scouts from Oklahoma and the contributions they have made to the state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 43RD OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT March 12, 1992, is hereby declared "Girl Scouts 80th Anniversary Day" in Oklahoma.
