A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION EXPRESSING PRIDE IN THE SELECTION OF ENID, OKLAHOMA, FOR THE DISPLAY OF THE REPLICA OF THE VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL; ENCOURAGING OKLAHOMANS TO VISIT THE DISPLAY; AND DIRECTING DISTRIBUTION.

WHEREAS, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, located in Washington D.C. is a solemn testament to the courageous sacrifice of so many individuals to the cause of freedom; and

WHEREAS, although the opportunity to visit this inspiring memorial may be limited, the chance to share in the emotional impact of the monument will be afforded to many when a half-scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial will be on display in Enid, Oklahoma, June 21 through 27, 1992; and

WHEREAS, the replica of this most stirring Washington D.C. monument will contain the names of all of the 58,175 persons whose names are inscribed on the actual monument; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma is indeed fortunate to have been granted the privilege to host this patriotic event.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 43RD OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT Oklahoma hereby expresses its pride in being selected to host the display of the replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Enid, Oklahoma, June 21 through 27, 1992.

THAT Oklahomans are hereby encouraged to visit this display and to pay tribute to the brave men and women who gave their lives, who are listed as missing in action, or who were prisoners of war during the Vietnam Conflict.

THAT copies of this resolution be dispatched to the Moving Wall Project Committee, Commander Colonel Craigie of Vance Air Force Base, the Mayor of Enid, the Enid Chamber of Commerce, John Willis, Secretary of the Department of Veterans Affairs and Governor David Walters.
