RESOLUTION NO. 1005 BY: MONSON

A RESOLUTION PRAISING AND COMMENDING THE HONORABLE JOHN B. WHITE ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES; AND DIRECTING DISTRIBUTION.

WHEREAS, the Honorable John B. White, a former member of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and a respected civil rights leader for decades, is retiring from the Department of Human Services on April 1, 1991; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure at the Department of Human Services, John B. White sustained his well-earned reputation for honesty, integrity and diligence, which well served him and the people for whom he worked so hard; and

WHEREAS, John B. White was the first supervisor of the Department of Human Services' fraud unit, working to see that taxpayer dollars were efficiently spent and that those in need received the full benefit of those dollars; and

WHEREAS, after more than 12 years heading up the fraud unit, John B. White was detailed to a management analyst position in the child support division, working to protect Oklahoma's most precious resource, its children; and

WHEREAS, in 1985, John B. White was assigned to a state administrative reviewer position, an assignment he fulfilled until his retirement; and

WHEREAS, John B. White contributed much more to the state he loves than just the exemplary work he performed as a House member and state employee - he stood up for those whose rights were trampled; and

WHEREAS, John B. White, a veteran of the Korean conflict, was a voice for and example to the African American community; and

WHEREAS, John B. White has long been a tireless booster for Oklahoma City and all of its people; and

WHEREAS, as this distinguished individual nears his retirement, it is appropriate that the Oklahoma House of Representatives, acting on behalf of all the people of this great state, take notice of John B. White and his many contributions to Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 43RD OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Honorable John B. White is hereby praised and commended for his lifetime of service to all Oklahomans, including service in the Oklahoma House of Representatives, as an employee of the Department of Human Services, and as a respected and esteemed civil rights leader.
