AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT RELATING TO PRISONS AND REFORMATORIES;

DECLARING CERTAIN PERSONS TO BE INELIGIBLE FOR
EARNED CREDITS; ALLOWING SAID PERSONS TO EARN
ACHIEVEMENT EARNED CREDITS IN CERTAIN
CIRCUMSTANCES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND
PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 138.2 of Title 57, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person convicted after September 1, 1991, of a crime or an
attempt to commit a crime provided for in Sections 885, 888, 1021,
1021.1, 1021.3, 1087, 1088, 1114 or 1123 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma
Statutes, shall not be eligible for state correctional institution
earned credits, except for the achievement earned credits authorized
by subsection F of Section 138 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
To qualify for the achievement credits, such person shall be in
compliance with the standards for class level 2 behavior, as defined
in subsection C of Section 138 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1991.
