AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT RELATING TO PURCHASING; REQUIRING THE OFFICE OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS, COUNTY PURCHASING AGENTS AND SCHOOL BOARDS OF EDUCATION TO OBTAIN CERTAIN INFORMATION FROM BIDDERS AND CONTRACTORS REGARDING MANUFACTURERS, COUNTRY OR COUNTRIES OF ORIGIN OF ANY SUPPLIES, EQUIPMENT OR MATERIALS PROVIDED; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN CONTRACT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 85.7a of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Office of Public Affairs shall require each bidder for an open market contract or a statewide contract for supplies, equipment or materials to provide information as to the manufacturer and country of origin of any such supplies, equipment or materials. If an item has more than one component which may have been

manufactured in more than one country, the bidder shall specify the countries of origin for the components.

B. Any open market contract or statewide contract shall require the contractor to obtain from all of his subcontractors information as to the manufacturer and country or countries of origin of any supplies, equipment or materials provided to the state.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1505.1 of Title 19, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The county purchasing agent shall require each bidder for county contracts for supplies, equipment or materials to provide information as to the manufacturer and country of origin of any supplies, equipment or materials for the county. If an item has more than one component which may have been manufactured in more than one country, the bidder shall specify the countries of origin for the components.

B. Any county contract for the purchase of supplies, equipment or materials shall require the contractor to obtain from all of his subcontractors information as to the manufacturer and country or countries of origin of any such supplies, equipment or materials provided to the county.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-117a of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any board of education for a school district shall require each bidder for a school district contract for supplies, equipment or materials to provide information as to the manufacturer and country of origin of any supplies, equipment or materials for the school district. If any item has more than one component which may have been manufactured in more than one country, the bidder shall specify the countries of origin for the components.

B. Any school district contract for the purchase of supplies, equipment or materials shall require the contractor to obtain from all his subcontractors information as to the manufacturer and country or countries of origin of any such supplies, equipment or materials provided to the school district.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 1992.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
