HOUSE BILL NO. 2143

AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT RELATING TO REVENUE AND TAXATION; PROHIBITING
THE AD VALOREM TASK FORCE FROM EXPENDING FUNDS
UNTIL CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS ARE MET; PROVIDING FOR
CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2946.2 of Title 68, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Ad Valorem Task Force shall not expend any funds to counties
for claims for reimbursement until such time as all counties have a
Computer-Assisted Mass Appraisal System approved and certified to
meet the standards as set forth in House Bill No. 1750 of the 2nd
Session of the 41st Oklahoma Legislature (Chapter 162, O.S.L. 1988)
and House Bill No. 1388 of the 1st Session of the 42nd Oklahoma
Legislature (Chapter 321, O.S.L. 1989). Upon such approval and
certification, the Coordinator of the Ad Valorem Task Force shall
notify the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Chairman of the
House and Senate Appropriation Committees.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
