AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT RELATING TO CITIES AND TOWNS AND COUNTIES AND COUNTY OFFICERS; PROHIBITING CITIES, TOWNS AND COUNTIES FROM REQUIRING EMPLOYEES TO WORK OVER CERTAIN NUMBER OF HOURS PER WEEK WITHOUT CERTAIN POLICY; REQUIRING POLICY TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT; REQUIRING COPY OF POLICY TO BE FURNISHED TO EMPLOYEES AND INTERESTED PERSONS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 56-101 of Title 11, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

No county of the State of Oklahoma shall require or allow employees to work in excess of forty (40) hours per week without establishing a comprehensive policy for compensation. Such policy shall be in compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. 201 et seq. All county employees shall be provided copies of said policy and copies shall be made available by the county clerk to all interested persons upon request.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 456 of Title 19, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

No city or town within the State of Oklahoma shall require or allow employees to work in excess of forty (40) hours per week without establishing a comprehensive policy for compensation. Such policy shall be in compliance with the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. 201 et seq. All city or town employees shall be provided copies of said policy and copies shall be made available by the city or town clerk to all interested persons upon request.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
