AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES; PROHIBITING  
CARRYING PASSENGERS IN EXCESS OF ACTUAL VEHICLE  
SEAT CAPACITY; MAKING VIOLATION A CRIMINAL OFFENSE;  
PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN  
EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-1114 of Title 47, unless  
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

No person shall operate any vehicle designed to carry six  
passengers or more on any road, street or highway in this state,  
when such vehicle is carrying any passengers in excess of actual  
vehicle seat capacity. A violation of this section shall, upon  
conviction, be deemed a misdemeanor.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
