AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT RELATING TO CHILDREN; CREATING THE ANTI GANG
ACTIVITIES ACT OF 1991; PROVIDING SHORT TITLE;
STATING PURPOSE OF ACT; ALLOWING MUNICIPALITIES AND
OTHER POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN
GUIDELINES, LAWS OR ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR
CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1636 of Title 10, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Anti Gang
Activities Act of 1991". The purpose of the act shall be to enhance
the ability of the state and municipal authorities to deter and
resist the encroachment of criminal gang activities and juvenile
crime in this state.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1637 of Title 10, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Under this act, municipalities or other political subdivisions of this state may:

1. Establish guidelines to remove graffiti from public buildings or structures and seek reimbursement for such removal from the offenders;

2. Establish and enforce curfew laws or ordinances for children and develop appropriate fines for any adult contributing to or knowingly allowing a child to violate a curfew law or ordinance;

3. Prohibit the wearing of certain gang-related colors, symbols or paraphernalia in any public or private school; and

4. Establish other guidelines as necessary to deter gang activities and juvenile crime.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective September 1, 1991.
