AN ACT RELATING TO CONTROLLED INDUSTRIAL WASTE;

REQUIRING AGENCY RULES PERMITTING RECYCLING OF
CONTROLLED INDUSTRIAL WASTE OR PERMITTING CERTAIN
FACILITIES TO REQUIRE SAME PROTECTION STATUTES
GOVERNING DISPOSAL OF WASTE; PROVIDING FOR
CODIFICATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-2014.5 of Title 63, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any rule promulgated by a state agency with authority over the
recycling of controlled industrial waste or the permitting of any
recycling facility or incinerator, including any such facility
designed for using such waste as fuel or energy, shall require the
same level of protection for the health, safety and welfare of the
public and the environment as those rules governing the disposal of
such waste.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
