AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT RELATING TO JUDGMENTS; AFFIRMING POWER OF
SUPREME COURT TO ISSUE CERTAIN STANDARDS; PROVIDING
FOR LIMITATION AS COURT DEEMS APPROPRIATE;
REQUIRING CONSIDERATION OF RECIPROCITY; PROVIDING
FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 728 of Title 12, unless there is
created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. This act affirms the power of the Supreme Court of the State
of Oklahoma to issue standards for extending full faith and credit
to the records and judicial proceedings of any court of any
federally recognized Indian nation, tribe, band or political
subdivision thereof, including courts of Indian offenses.

B. In issuing any such standard the Supreme Court of the State
of Oklahoma may extend such recognition in whole or in part to such
type or types of judgments of the tribal courts as it deems
appropriate. In establishing any such standards the Supreme Court

shall consider the matter of recognition of the reciprocity of judgments of the courts of the State of Oklahoma in such courts.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1992.
