AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT RELATING TO SCHOOLS; REQUIRING COURT TO AWARD
REASONABLE ATTORNEY FEES TO BE TAXED AS COSTS
AGAINST STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION OR STATE
DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION IN CERTAIN CASES; AND
PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-104.7 of Title 70, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

In any civil action in which the State Board of Education or the
State Department of Education pursues a claim against a district
board of education, the district board of education shall be awarded
a reasonable attorneys fee if the district board of education
prevails. The fee shall be assessed by the court as costs against
the State Board of Education or State Department of Education, as
appropriate.
