2ND CONFERENCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 1991, Section 250.4, as amended by Section 3 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 870 of the 2nd Session of the 44th Oklahoma Legislature, which relates to state officers' salaries; and modifying implementation of certain state officers' salary increases.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 1991, Section 250.4, as amended by Section 3 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 870 of the 2nd Session of the 44th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 250.4 Pursuant to provisions of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma from and after the beginning date of a term of office which commences in, or after, January, 1995, the following officers of the State of Oklahoma shall be annually compensated for their services, payable monthly, as follows:

1. The Governor shall receive a salary of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00);

2. The Lieutenant Governor shall receive a salary equal to the salary received by an associate district judge in a county with a population greater than ten thousand (10,000) and less than thirty thousand (30,000);

3. The Attorney General shall receive a salary equal to the salary received by a district judge;

4. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction shall receive a salary equal to the salary received by a district judge;

5. Each member of the Corporation Commission shall receive a salary equal to the salary received by an associate district judge in a county with a population of over thirty thousand (30,000);

6. The State Treasurer shall receive a salary equal to the salary received by an associate district judge in a county with a population of over thirty thousand (30,000);

7. The State Auditor and Inspector shall receive a salary equal to the salary received by an associate district judge in a county with a population of over thirty thousand (30,000);

8. The State Insurance Commissioner shall receive a salary equal to the salary received by an associate district judge in a county with a population of over thirty thousand (30,000); and

9. The Commissioner of Labor shall receive a salary equal to the salary received by a special judge.

Provided, however, this salary schedule shall be implemented over a four-year period with each elected official's salary increasing annually beginning January 1, 1995, through January 1, 1998, by an amount equal to one-fourth (1/4) of the difference between the elected official's January 1, 1994 salary and the January 1, 1995 salary of the respective judge used as a reference in this section. Beginning January 1, 1999 and thereafter the salaries of the elected officials specified shall be an amount as specified in paragraphs 2 through 9 of this section.
