COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to schools; creating School Boards 2000 Task Force; stating the purpose; providing for membership, appointment, reimbursement, duties, officers, meetings and staffing of the Task Force; requiring certain report; providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. A. There is hereby created a legislative task force to be known as the School Boards 2000 Task Force. The purpose of the Task Force is to study the roles and responsibilities of district boards of education in preparing schools for the twenty-first century. The Task Force shall be composed of twenty-one (21) members to be appointed as follows:

1. Seven members to be appointed by the Governor:

- a. two of the members to be members of district boards of education. One such member shall be selected from the First Congressional District, and one such member shall be selected from the Second Congressional District. One such member shall represent a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership and one such member shall represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership,
- b. one of the members to be a school teacher selected from either the First Congressional District or the Second Congressional District, and shall represent

either a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership or represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership,

- c. one of the members to be an administrator in a public school system selected from either the First Congressional District or the Second Congressional District, and shall represent either a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership or represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership, depending on the size of school district represented by the school teacher. The school teacher and the administrator shall not represent the same size school district, and
- d. three members to be selected at large;

2. Seven members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

- a. two of the members to be members of district boards of education. One such member shall be selected from the Third Congressional District, and one such member shall be selected from the Fourth Congressional District. One such member shall represent a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership and one such member shall represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership,
- b. one of the members to be a school teacher selected from either the Third Congressional District or the Fourth Congressional District, and shall represent either a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership or represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership,
- c. one of the members to be an administrator in a public school system selected from either the Third

Congressional District or the Fourth Congressional District, and shall represent either a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership or represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership, depending on the size of school district represented by the school teacher. The school teacher and the administrator shall not represent the same size school district, and

d. three members to be selected at large; and

3. Seven members to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate:

a. two of the members to be members of district boards of education. One such member shall be selected from the Fifth Congressional District, and one such member shall be selected from the Sixth Congressional District. One such member shall represent a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership and one such member shall represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership,

b. one of the members to be a school teacher selected from either the Fifth Congressional District or the Sixth Congressional District, and shall represent either a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership or represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership,

c. one of the members to be an administrator in a public school system selected from either the Fifth Congressional District or the Sixth Congressional District, and shall represent either a small school district with five hundred (500) or fewer average daily membership or represent a large school district with over five hundred (500) average daily membership, depending on the size of school district

represented by the school teacher. The school teacher and the administrator shall not represent the same size school district, and

d. three members to be selected at large.

B. The Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 31, 1994.

C. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall designate the chair of the Task Force. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate the vice-chair of the Task Force. The chair shall call the meetings, and meetings shall be held as necessary to accomplish the purpose of the Task Force.

D. Staff assistance for the Task Force shall be provided by the Senate, the House of Representatives, and the Legislative Service Bureau.

E. Except as otherwise provided, members of the Task Force shall not be compensated for performance of their duties but shall be eligible for reimbursement by the appointing authority for all necessary and actual travel expenses pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act, Section 500.1 et seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Any legislator appointed to such Task Force shall be eligible for reimbursement in accordance with Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. NONCODIFICATION Section 1 of this act shall not be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1994.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
