A Concurrent Resolution commending and congratulating
Shannon Miller; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, on April 16, 1993, Shannon Miller captured the World
Gymnastics Crown by winning the all-around women's title at the
World Gymnastics Championships in Birmingham, England; and

WHEREAS, this sixteen-year-old from Edmond, Oklahoma totaled an
amazing 39.062 points from the four gymnastics disciplines comprised

of the uneven bars, the beam, the floor exercise and the vault; and WHEREAS, Shannon Miller began competing in gymnastics in 1987 and that year won the Class II Oklahoma State Championship in the all-around; and

WHEREAS, in 1988, Shannon Miller qualified for national competition and placed second in the nation that year; and

WHEREAS, in the summer of 1988, Shannon Miller competed in the Junior Pan American Games in Ponce, Puerto Rico and placed second all-around, took four medals home and helped the United States team take home the coveted gold medal; and

WHEREAS, in 1989, Shannon Miller took third place and won a gold medal on the uneven bars at the Olympic Festival in Oklahoma City; and

WHEREAS, Shannon Miller has won numerous other medals in gymnastics meets all over the world; and

WHEREAS, in 1992, Shannon Miller won the United States Olympic Trials after recovering from an elbow injury only weeks earlier; and

WHEREAS, Shannon Miller went on to dominate the Olympics in Barcelona, Spain by winning two silver and three bronze medals and nearly winning the coveted gold medal; and

WHEREAS, on the way to those five medals, Shannon Miller was the first American female to win the compulsory all-around, the first American to win the compulsory and optional all-around, the first American to make all four individual event finals at the Olympics and the recipient of the highest medal count for any American gymnast in a non-boycotted Olympics; and

WHEREAS, Shannon Miller's love and talent for the sport of gymnastics has inspired many budding young gymnasts across the nation; and

WHEREAS, Head Coach Steve Nunno and Assistant Coach Peggy Liddick have coached Shannon Miller with great dedication and professionalism.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature commends and congratulates Shannon Miller on her outstanding achievements and accomplishments in the gymnastics arena and upon her excellent representation of the City of Edmond and the State of Oklahoma worldwide.
