WHEREAS, on April 22, 1993, Officer Constantine George (Gus)  
Spanos, at the age of 24, was fatally wounded during a traffic stop;  
and

WHEREAS, Officer Gus Spanos died in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, Officer Gus Spanos was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and later became a model Oklahoma citizen and resident; and

WHEREAS, in May of 1991, Officer Gus Spanos received a degree in education at the University of Tulsa; and

WHEREAS, during his years at the University of Tulsa, Officer Gus Spanos made a name for himself as an outstanding offensive lineman for the football team; and

WHEREAS, Officer Gus Spanos was a man of great integrity who took seriously the business of keeping the streets of Tulsa safe for its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the city of Tulsa and the State of Oklahoma have suffered a great loss with the death of Officer Gus Spanos.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature extends its most sincere condolences to the family of Officer Gus Spanos.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature joins Officer Gus Spanos' widow, Christie Spanos, and his father, George Spanos, in mourning the death of such a fine and dedicated young man.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to the family of Officer Gus Spanos.
