A Concurrent Resolution memorializing Glade R. Kirkpatrick;
and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, with the death of Glade R. Kirkpatrick on May 4, 1993,
the State of Oklahoma has lost a dedicated public servant, a great
leader, and a remarkable person; and

WHEREAS, Glade R. Kirkpatrick was considered to be the
"political architect" in the development of the Arkansas River
Navigation System; and

WHEREAS, Glade R. Kirkpatrick was instrumental in winning
congressional approval of the \$1.2 billion project extending from
Mississippi to the Port of Catoosa; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas River development was just one facet of
Glade R. Kirkpatrick's amazing life; and

WHEREAS, Glade R. Kirkpatrick was elected to the Oklahoma
Legislature in 1934 and served for eight years as a representative
from Tulsa County; and

WHEREAS, Glade R. Kirkpatrick was chairman of the state Game and
Fish Commission from 1942 to 1946; and

WHEREAS, Glade R. Kirkpatrick was named chairman of the Tulsa
Chamber of Commerce Waterway Committee in 1942; and

WHEREAS, Glade R. Kirkpatrick served as chairman of the Red River Compact Commission from 1942 to 1946; and

WHEREAS, Glade R. Kirkpatrick also served as a director to the Tulsa Real Estate Board, director of the Oklahoma Title Association, president of the Oklahoma Real Estate Association and vice president of the National Association of Real Estate Boards; and

WHEREAS, at his death at the age of 87, Glade R. Kirkpatrick was the chairman of the Guaranty Abstract Company, a company that he helped to found; and

WHEREAS, Glade R. Kirkpatrick will be missed by the great State of Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
