A Concurrent Resolution memorializing the Oklahoma
Congressional Delegation to support the National Highway
System; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the Intermodal
Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 which established a
155,000-mile National Highway System; and

WHEREAS, the National Highway System is a vital link because
three-fourths of all freight is shipped by motor carriers nationally
and even by a larger percentage in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration submitted the
National Highway System to Congress in December, 1993, and the
National Highway System must be approved by Congress and signed by
the President of the United States by September 30, 1995; and

WHEREAS, it is important for Congress to approve the National
Highway System in 1994 in order to avoid any potential deadlines
that may be associated with Congress in 1995, and to avoid the
possibility that the National Highway System would be altered and
more highway users' tax dollars will be diverted to urban mass
transit and other alternative methods of transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration has approved the
routes submitted by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation to be
a part of the National Highway System and the routes include all of
the important highway corridors in this state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the highways are the backbone of the transportation system
in the United States and that an investment in the National Highway
System is an investment in the safety and quality of our highways.

THAT the Oklahoma Congressional Delegation is strongly urged to
support the National Highway System and to urge their Congressional
colleagues to support the National Highway System.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to all members of
the Oklahoma Congressional Delegation.
