A Joint Resolution clarifying legislative intent concerning the mandatory pay increase for certain employees; providing for certain lump-sum payments; and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, clarification is needed to effectuate the intent of the Legislature concerning the mandatory pay increase for classified state employees provided for in Section 23, Chapter 367, O.S.L. 1992.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. Effective July 1, 1993, current classified and unclassified employees who received a mandatory one-step increase effective December 1, 1992, pursuant to subsection A or B of Section 23, Chapter 367, O.S.L. 1992, and who are still employed by the state, shall receive an increase in pay equal to the difference between that mandatory one-step increase and the amount they would have received had that increase been two and one-half percent (2.5%). The amount of the increase in pay effective July 1, 1993, that is authorized in this section shall not be affected by any changes in an employee's salary between the December 1, 1992 mandatory increase and July 1, 1993.

Employing agencies shall provide these classified and unclassified employees who received a mandatory one-step increase effective December 1, 1992, a one-time payment according to a table developed by the Office of Personnel Management. The table shall provide for payment amounts equivalent to the difference between the mandatory one-step increase and the amount that would have been received had that increase been two and one-half percent (2.5%) for the period between December 1, 1992 and June 30, 1993. This payment shall be based on the employee's actual grade and step on November 30, 1992, and it shall not reflect any discretionary step increase pursuant to subsection D or E of Section 23, Chapter 367, O.S.L. 1992.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
