AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to intoxicating liquors; providing that Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act not be construed to require certain persons to obtain brewer's license or to subject certain beer to taxation; providing for application of certain provisions; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 521.1 of Title 37, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The provisions of the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act, Section 502 et seq. of Title 37 of the Oklahoma Statutes, shall not be construed to require a person who produces beer for his or her own personal use, or the use of his or her family members or guests, which is not sold or offered for sale, to obtain a brewer's license or to subject such beer to the taxes imposed pursuant to Section 542 of Title 37 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Nothing in this section shall be construed to exempt such person from any provision of subsection A of Section 537 of Title 37 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1994.
