AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to courts; requiring certain judges to attend certain continuing legal education courses; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1407 of Title 20, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Each district, associate district, or special judge hearing juvenile or family law matters shall attend twelve (12) instructional hours of continuing legal education per year in the area of juvenile or family law. This requirement shall be met by attendance at continuing legal education programs sponsored by an organization listed in the rules for Continuing Legal Education approved by the Oklahoma Supreme Court with curriculum in the area of juvenile or family law.

B. The Supreme Court shall adopt rules to ensure compliance with this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1994.
