AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to civil procedure; requiring court review of certain actions; requiring entry of certain court order under certain circumstances; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1119 of Title 12, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The district court shall review every civil action brought against this state or any political subdivision thereof by any prisoner of this state. If the court finds, after reviewing a prisoner's petition, that there is no basis in law or fact to support the allegations contained in the petition, the court shall dismiss the state without motion from the state's attorney and without a hearing.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1994.
