AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; requiring State Board of Education to establish alternate system of education for certain students; requiring promulgation of rules; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-101.2 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The State Board of Education shall establish an alternate system of education for juveniles who are tried as adults and found guilty of a felony or who are found guilty of offenses that would be felonies if they were tried as adults. The alternate system shall vest responsibility for providing education for such juveniles with the State Board of Education; district boards of education shall have no responsibility for providing educational services for such juveniles. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules implementing the provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective on July 1, 1994.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
