An Act relating to used lead-acid battery and used motor oil recycling; creating the Oklahoma Lead-Acid Battery and Used Motor Oil Recycling Act; requiring seller of lead-acid batteries to post certain sign; defining term; requiring sellers of motor oil to post certain sign; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2001 of Title 27A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Sections 1 through 3 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Lead-Acid Battery and Used Motor Oil Recycling Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2002 of Title 27A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person offering lead-acid batteries for sale to end-use consumers shall post and maintain a sign at or near the point of display or sale to inform the public that lead-acid batteries are accepted for recycling. For purposes of this act, a "lead-acid battery" means a lead-acid electrical device used in boats, planes and motor vehicles.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2003 of Title 27A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person offering motor oil for sale to end-use consumers shall post and maintain a sign at or near the point of display or sale to inform the public of the location of the nearest used oil collection center.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective September 1, 1993.
