A Concurrent Resolution proclaiming the week of May 16
through 20, 1994, as Oklahoma Kids Drug Free and Proud Week
in the State of Oklahoma; commending the program's
supporters; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, 115,000 students from 430 Oklahoma schools signed a
pledge to say "no" to alcohol, tobacco and other dangerous drugs in
conjunction with a statewide and nationwide "call to action"; and

WHEREAS, 115,000 students from 430 Oklahoma schools pledged to
lead a drug-free life, to help their friends say "no" to alcohol,
tobacco and other dangerous drugs and to stand up for what they know
is right; and

WHEREAS, the inspiring pledge of 115,000 students from 430
Oklahoma schools is being recognized throughout the nation as one of

the most significant proclamations ever made by youth in our country's history; and

WHEREAS, 115,000 students from 430 Oklahoma schools who have pledged to be "Drug Free and Proud" exemplify the true spirit of our state's song, "You're doin' fine, Oklahoma--Oklahoma! O.K."; and

WHEREAS, the Drug Free and Proud Red Ribbon Celebration Pledge Drive has been sponsored by the Oklahoma Federation of Parents, the Oklahoma State Department of Education, the Oklahoma National Guard and Homeland Stores, Inc. The inaugural pledge drive resulted in 115,000 signatures which represents one out of every three Oklahoma students in grades kindergarten through the senior year in high school and one out of every four Oklahoma schools. The Oklahoma pledge drive had more pledges than all the other states' pledges combined.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature proclaims the week of May 16 through 20, 1994, as Oklahoma Kids Drug Free and Proud Week in the State of Oklahoma.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature commends the Oklahoma Federation of Parents, an affiliate of the National Family Partnership; the Oklahoma State Department of Education; the Oklahoma National Guard; and Homeland Stores, Inc. for their support of this program.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to Larry Johnston, Executive Director of the Oklahoma Federation of Parents; Sandy Garrett, State Superintendent of Public Instruction and Secretary of Education; Major General Gary D. Maynard, Adjutant General of the Oklahoma National Guard; and Max E. Raydon, President and Chief Executive Officer of Homeland Stores, Inc.
