An Act relating to supervision of the state electoral process; amending Section 36 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 896 of the 2nd Session of the 44th Oklahoma Legislature, which relates to an appropriation to the State Election Board; modifying appropriation; stating purposes; providing for duties and compensation of employees of the State Election Board; limiting the salary of the Secretary of the State Election Board; amending Section 38 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 896 of the 2nd Session of the 44th Oklahoma Legislature, which relates to an appropriation to the State Ethics Commission; modifying appropriation; stating purpose; providing for duties and compensation of employees of the Ethics Commission; providing budgetary limitations; and providing lapse date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 36 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 896 of the 2nd Session of the 44th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 36. There is hereby appropriated to the State Election Board from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, the sum of ~~Five Million Three Hundred Seventy-eight Thousand Four Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$5,378,490.00)~~ Five Million Nine Hundred Seventeen Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-one Dollars (\$5,917,321.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Election Board by law.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Election Board by law shall be set by the Secretary of the State Election Board. The salary of the Secretary of the State Election Board shall not exceed Sixty-four Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-one Dollars (\$64,391.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995.

ETHICS COMMISSION

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 38 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 896 of the 2nd Session of the 44th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 38. There is hereby appropriated to the State Ethics Commission from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, the sum of ~~Three Hundred Seventeen Thousand~~

~~Five Hundred Twenty-two Dollars (\$317,522.00)~~ Three Hundred Eighteen Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-three Dollars (\$318,693.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Ethics Commission by law.

SECTION 4. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Ethics Commission by law shall be set by the Executive Director of the Ethics Commission. The Ethics Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 5. The appropriations made by this act shall be subject to fiscal year limitations and may be encumbered through June 30, 1995. Any unexpended funds remaining after November 15, 1995, shall lapse and be transferred to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year.
