An Act relating to agriculture; designating Department of Agriculture as official exotic livestock disease control agency; authorizing the issuance of certain rules and regulations in intrastate commerce; authorizing the issuance of certain rules and regulations in interstate commerce; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-291 of Title 2, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The State Board of Agriculture shall be the official exotic livestock disease control agency of the State of Oklahoma, and shall have the authority to issue and enforce rules and regulations governing the movement and testing of exotic livestock as defined in Section 6-290.3 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in intrastate commerce with regards to disease emergency, disease control, or disease eradication.

B. The State Board of Agriculture shall have the authority to issue and enforce rules and regulations governing the movement and testing of exotic livestock as defined by Section 6-290.3 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in interstate commerce as required or allowed by federal law.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective September 1, 1994.
