HOUSE BILL NO. 1203

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to intoxicating liquors; prohibiting the issuance of licenses to sell nonintoxicating beverages, commonly referred to as 3.2 beer, for certain locations; prohibiting the sale, possession or consumption of such beverages on certain land; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 163.26 of Title 37, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. No retail license or permit to sell beverages containing more than one-half of one percent (1/2 of 1%) of alcohol measured by volume, and not more than three and two-tenths percent (3.2%) of alcohol measured by weight shall be issued for any location on any state or federal wildlife refuge or wildlife management area.

B. No person shall sell, possess or consume any beverage containing more than one-half of one percent (1/2 of 1%) of alcohol measured by volume, and not more than three and two-tenths percent (3.2%) of alcohol measured by weight on any any state or federal wildlife refuge or wildlife management area.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
