HOUSE BILL NO. 2194

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to poor persons; restricting payment of certain assistance to certain persons; setting conditions; requiring certain verifications; providing applicability; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 231.1 of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any person who is otherwise eligible to receive assistance pursuant to Aid to Families with Dependent Children who has resided in this state less than six (6) months on a continuous basis shall receive the lesser assistance in an amount equal to:

1. The amount received by persons of similar circumstances residing in this state for six (6) months or more; or

2. The benefits such person received or would have received in his last state of residence.

B. Any person who has resided in this state on a continuous basis for six (6) months or more is eligible to receive the authorized full level of benefits.

C. In addition to other eligibility requirements, to receive such benefits, any applicant must prove verification as to length of residence in this state and if a resident of this state less than six (6) months, the previous state of residence.

D. The provisions of this section shall only apply to new applications for assistance made on or after July 1, 1994.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
