AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Office of the State Fire  
Marshal; providing duties and compensation of  
employees; limiting the salary of the State Fire  
Marshal; providing budgetary limitations on full-  
time-equivalent employees and expenditures;  
providing an effective date; and declaring an  
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Office of the State Fire Marshal by law shall be set by the State Fire Marshal. The salary of the State Fire Marshal shall not exceed Forty-three Thousand Two Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$43,260.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995. The Office of the State of Fire Marshal for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures

excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1994.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
