RESOLUTION NO. 1011

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution petitioning the President and Congress of the United States to retain the military policy banning homosexuals from military services; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the United States Armed Forces have served as the beacon of freedom and strength for the citizens of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the United States Armed Forces have traditionally answered the call of its world neighbors during times of crises and conflicts; and

WHEREAS, the United States Armed Forces have gained respect internationally as a leader in democratic ideals; and

WHEREAS, the United States Armed Forces are comprised of dedicated servicemen and servicewomen whose valor, selflessness and character exemplifies the spirit of the United States Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, the spirit of America's military personnel is threatened by the proposed abolishment of the military ban on homosexuals, whose lifestyles contradict the ideals of America's military establishment; and

WHEREAS, Americans nationwide have overwhelmingly voiced their opposition to the abolishment of the ban.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 44TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature does hereby petition the
President of the United States, the Congress of the United States
and the United States Joint Chiefs of Staff to retain the Pentagon
policy prohibiting homosexuals in the military.

THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to the President
of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, the
Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Chairman
of the United States Joint Chiefs of Staff and the Oklahoma
Congressional Delegation.
